Meetings are held on the first Sunday of every other month at 1:00 pm starting in January. The meetings that fall on a holiday or holiday weekend may be rescheduled.






























No Child Deserves to Live in Fear



Thursday November 27th 2014, I had an early "Thanksgiving" dinner with my wife, son and daughter in law. After finishing off the pumpkin pie and whipped crème, I walked out side to an already packed bike and an awaiting companion on his packed bike. We had previously agreed to "kick stands up" at noon from my house for our annual Turkey Day Run. Anyone who knows me knows what group I am associated with if not you can figure it out pretty easy, so no need for names. Every year we ride to our annual Turkey Day Run which we hold on the Saturday after Thanksgiving. We try to pick a warm venue, and thus all have Thursday for traditional Thanksgiving with their families. Friday to travel Saturday for the "Party" of a lifetime, and Sunday to return to home.

When my associate and I left Tulsa on Thursday high noon it was about 34° and we rode south to Waxahachie, TX to spend the night. It got warmer as we went south. Friday morning bright and early, we rode on south to just north of San Antonio where the weather was nice and warm. A few hundred of us were already there and had things warming up. Grilled burgers for lunch, fajita tacos for dinner (very authentic) and if you can think of something to drink, it was there. Live band on a flat trailer started playing about an hour before dark and went until about 10pm (starts getting cold, even that far south).

Then Saturday morning what we all have been waiting for ever since last year, our version of Turkey Day! All started with breakfast burritos, any fruit you could want, juice, coffee, you name it. Meet and greet socialize with folks you only see a couple of times a year. Tall tales and comparing motorcycles, Ahh it don't get any better than this! By noon the numbers past the hundreds and was in the four digit range! We hade a one acre lot to park bikes, but we had to talk to the neighbor and take down a fence to add to the bike parking. The Temp reached the low 80's it was a very nice day not too much wind picture perfect.

About noon, lunch was pulled pork BBQ, cooked on site with all the trimmings, and all the drinks you cared to drink. By about one o'clock it was elbow to elbow and in my 11 years of doing this run this was the biggest I have ever seen. The day went by fast too fast as there is never enough time to visit as long as I want with different folks, but I made the best of it. Dinner was our traditional type of dinner, beans, Mexican rice, chili,



and chicken tamales. All homemade on site it doesn't get any better. Again the band started about an hour before dark and played into the night.



We agreed to meet for breakfast at 8, and kickstands up at 9 all went off without a hitch. The 18TH Annual Oklahoma City Motorcycle Show will be held at The State Fair Park located at 500 Land Rush Drive in OKC. The Show will be held in a heated building. We went back and I got out of the car and went over to ask her if we could take her somewhere. She didn't appear to be startled with a stranger approaching her like I did. She looked up and said "oh sweetheart that is very kind, but I am going clear across town and that is too far." I asked her where she was going and she replied 31st and Garnett. She said the bus would be here shortly and take her right to where she needed to go. She told me she had some business to take care of. I went back over to the car and told Darrell where she was going across town. He said he didn't care how far she needed to go, we were going to take her. I went back to her and told her to come with me we are taking you. She said "really, that is so kind of you. Are you sure?" I noticed her sweet smile and the way her eyes twinkled. She held on to my arm as we walked to the

car. Once in the car I could sense a peace about her and a spirit of kindness and love. I told her our names, she said hers was Fern but we could call her Granny. She told us she was 93 years old and lives by herself and has since her husband died 27 years ago. I asked her if she had worked here in Tulsa. I could tell she was proud of her time in the cafeteria. She went on to say she just did whatever it took to make a living. She told us that she and her husband were partners in life. She didn't tell us this so we would feel sorry for her: she said it more with a sense of contentment, and like she had no regrets whatsoever. I asked her if she had a phone number so we could stay in touch. She told us she didn't have a phone. We arrived at 31st and Garnett and told her we would wait on her and give her a ride home. She kindly refused and said she would just take the bus down the street to 11th and Garnett where she lived. She said she would pray for us and keep us in her prayers. I wanted so badly to take her home with me...vou know adopt her some way, but I could tell she wouldn't have any part of that. She offered us money for gas but instead Darrell put a

little cash in her hand and wished her a Merry Christmas. As we drove away we were both in a state of awe. It may seem like we did a good deed, but really it was "Granny" who blessed us. I can't describe how I felt on the inside. I just looked over at Darrell and said "we have been touched by an angel." He unhesitatingly agreed. We both couldn't stop smiling the rest of the day. You know we never made it to Myers-Duren that day, but there's always next year unless of course it's a cold windy day and there's someone sitting at the bus stop.






had a bike ready. I'm new around here, so at this point I didn't ask a lot of questions. So I slinked




