


Fire Con West To The Constitution of the Const

Hello, my name is Gina, though some of you may know me as Tiny Tank. I'm 52 and the only thing that has remained the same is that my life is constantly changing lanes. When it comes to survival, I've been at it since the very beginning. In 1963, I was born with hip dysplasia and was given Morphine for pain and they told my mom that I would never walk. So, from a young age, I started looking for something to dull the pain in any way I could. Whenever I was loaded. I thought that I could be myself. This manifested itself when I pulled out the drawers in the bathroom to get into the medicine cabinet and drink cough syrup, and even at family gatherings, I learned to sneak drinks from my daddy's beer. I could open up, talk, and be accepted when I was flying high, but unlike others, I didn't party. I got loaded to black out! After many years of abusing my body, I realized it was time to make a change.

When I rolled a car in June of '02 which could have killed both myself and my son, I started the journey of recovery. We were incredibly fortunate to walk away from that accident with minimal damages. I walked away with a bruised and bloody scalp, as my hair had got sucked out the window and pulled under the car, and my son miraculously didn't suffer a single bruise. The next month, in July, someone passed through my life that helped me change lanes again. It has been very rough at times, but it has brought me to where I am today.


When I was diagnosed with breast cancer in '04, I thought my life was over. I suffered through surgeries, ports, chemo, baldness, and even losing my breasts. Hats became part of my daily attire. But the biker community didn't let me fall or sit on a pity pot for long. For a time, they helped me change lanes once again. My friends helped me to realize that cancer is a word, not a sentence. I also learned that boobs don't define who a woman is, but it is the inner beauty that makes

the lady. It was through this ordeal that I began to find my inner strength.

At this point in my life, I've changed lanes once more from victim to survivor. Today I make a daily choice to live as a survivor. Nowadays, I enjoy the sounds of the birds chirping outside my window, whereas before I would lay in my bed, screaming "Shut up!" and holding my aching head after a night of drinking and drugging. I look forward to the sunrise, rather than dreading it, and thank my higher power for another day above ground.

I have learned that there are no 'bad' days, just good days and learning days. Be good to yourself. Get your knees in the breeze and watch out for those cages. I've learned to forgive others, but more importantly, I've learned to forgive and accept myself, with all of my scars included. Nobody knows, and I certainly don't know, what tomorrow holds, so enjoy every moment and the diversity it brings to your life. To everyone reading this, know that everything can change in the blink of an eye. Be sure to take a moment to enjoy each other. A big thank you to all the brothers and sisters that helped me along the way. Much love and respect.

Caring for Kids with cancer with toys, cooking and cruising

Where do we start?

I have to share the story on how this whole party got started before I can tell you anything about it. It's about a little boy named Ryder Herring.



In May, 2011, Ryder, an active 4 year old, went from playing and fine to slurred and stumbling in 48 hours, and within a week, it was confirmed Ryder had brain cancer. He had to undergo an operation for a tumor on his brain stem, followed up with sedated radiation five days a week for six weeks in OKC and Chicago, THEN clinical treatments, plus 30 medications a day. By Thanksgiving 2011, Ryder was in remission.

WAIT. There's more. Unfortunately, in June, 2012, Ryder's cancer came back with a vengeance. A tumor had wrapped around Ryder's brain stem and all potential treatment options were off the table, so the only choices were 'light chemotherapy' and drugs that required his mom Elly to wear a hazmat suit and gloves when giving Ryder his meds. In addition, Ryder had to take adult doses of steroids that turned him into a miserable

little boy with 'roid rage,' weight gain and muscle pain so bad that he couldn't walk. After four months, the prognosis was the same, so Elly and the family made a decision to stop the insanity and let Ryder enjoy his remaining time without the debilitating drugs.

On March 14, 2013, the angels came for Ryder.

Elly's description of Ryder's last days is so touching: "On the day before he passed, he finally admitted he was in pain and needed something to cope. That evening Ryder fell asleep. He was surrounded by his family and friends. The following morning I was awakened by the hospice nurse saying she couldn't read his blood pressure. It was almost time. I pleaded and begged for him not to go. The nurse whispered to me that I needed to tell him it was okay to leave. I felt a calm come over me. I leaned in and whispered to Ryder that it was okay to go with the angels. He took two more breaths, and it was over." See the story in its entirety on www.okbiker.net. (Get tissues! You can see me, but I'm not here. You see, in my mind I'm over there. I know you may not understand, but sometimes I go back to a foreign land. A place I served with brave men who I would stand and serve with once again. It's different now though, I don't want to be there. What these memories bring back recreate the fear. Fear we had to hold inside, to keep our heads, to stay alive. Growing up with movies - watching our heroes leading men into battle, on foot, in tanks, or even on horseback - glorified wars with action scenes and explosions, the good guys kicking ass and special effect illusions. If you've not seen the battle grounds, civilian or soldier, in the country or towns, then you'll never know about the wounds that won't heal; ones you can't see and can't feel. It's a small percentage of our men and women that have served in these lands and military stations. Most have come home and many have died, and

at one time or another we have all cried. Cried for the men and women we lost, serving beside us paying the ultimate cost. Cried for their families, children, spouses and others, we honor them by remembering our sisters and brothers. Sometimes we cry for our own wounds and scars, the ones you can see and the ones in our minds and hearts. You see, though we may have come home from these foreign lands, the lands followed us home, the deserts, the jungles, the sands. The memories, dreams, thoughts and the nightmares; we ask who can help us, who really cares?

Thinking about hurting or killing yourself

- Looking for ways to kill yourself
- Talking about death, dying or suicide
- Self-destructive behavior such as drug abuse, weapons, etc.

Additional warning signs

- Feelings of hopelessness, feeling as though there's no way out
- Anxiety, agitation, sleeplessness, mood swings
- Feeling like there is no reason to live
- Rage or anger
- Engaging in risky activities without thinking
- Increasing alcohol or drug abuse
- Withdrawing from family and friends
