One Miracle at a Time

I'm going to start with an apology to the people I interviewed from RU4C (Riders United for Children). I promised them one story and they got another. As I started this story, seeing a little boy covered in dirt and blood, sitting in an ambulance, I knew giving you stats of children and families in crisis is never going to have the kind of impact a single image will.

I met a few RU4C members and their President, Noony, who has 'never met a stranger,' but ask him to talk about him, and its crickets. Usually, getting an organization to STOP talking about themselves is a problem, I have never experienced the opposite. Ask Noony or his band about the people they've helped and he'll tell you how lucky HE is to have met THEM, or ask about his little girl and he's chatting like he mainlines Starbucks. They gave me a few quotes and I could get the rest from RU4C's Facebook page.

That's when things got interesting.

I was about to walk away when a guy walked up and said he was looking for a group to ride with. That's where Preacher Noony was born. "Now brother, you gotta understand, we ain't no MC. We are recognized by the CoC and we got our 501c3, but if you ain't willin' to work hard for nothin', we ain't your club. We work hard most days, but we'll always have your back and we'll be workin' right alongside you. We are a family and you are welcome if you can handle that. We don't do this for attention, okay? Walking away after you slipped a check under the door is really hard, but that's the way it has to be."

It was as if a wave of change came over everyone. He was the preacher telling his congregation they were going to a day at the spa. RU4C is happy to take your donation, but they show up at rallies, concerts and events to pick up trash, park cars or do odd jobs to raise funds, all with a smile. I had no idea that people did that! Every penny RU4C makes goes to helping those in need, and they give of themselves, working in summer heat, winter cold, doing hard labor, dirty jobs and more to help their Okie brothers and sisters. What started in Arkansas as seven guys wanting to help their fellow man has grown over three states, but the OK chapter had only two members when Noony and his band of brothers and sisters found them in 2014; today, RU4C-OK now has about 50 people. In the past year, they have helped 27 families, donated money to three organizations and they gave gifts to countless kids at Christmas last year; each child gets a new coat, gloves and a special something they wanted.

Pause for Poker Run and help those who can't speak up

It's really sad that there are so many animals that have no homes. food or people to love, because that's all most dogs and cats want (well, no one knows what cats want). It's made worse when we have shelters overflowing with animals and animal control agencies are restricted in where they can go by geography or budgetary cuts, but there are people who go out and gather up abandoned cats and dogs, clean them. feed them and they transport them to states like Colorado where the need for pets exceeds the number of pets available for adoption. These same people also go in to places where disaster has occurred (like Katrina), and they help the pets left behind. They also spay and neuter and offer pet training to control pet abandonment in the future.

All of this costs money; money that government agencies don't contribute much to, so it is truly a labor of love. And Peaceful Animal Adoption Shelter (PAAS), a local group leading the charge to help local dogs and cats find new homes, is hosting a Poker Run on Oct. 1 to help Oklahoma's homeless furry friends.

The Run starts at 9 a.m. at the PAAS store in Vinita (last bike out at 11 a.m.), they have three card stops with last stop at the Road Hog Saloon in Afton. But it doesn't end there; they will have an auction and live music so you can make a day of it. Hanging out listening to good music while you enjoy the cooler temps with good friends and a beer has to be



the best way to spend a day. Knowing you are doing something special to help local abandoned pets find new homes makes it even better. Payouts are \$250 high hand and \$100 for worst hand (which is plenty of kibble for that cute dog you'll be taking home from the shelter, hint, hint.)

PAAS has lots of info on their Facebook or Website page (www.paasvinita.com) and you can call them at (918) 256-7227 if you have questions (or if you want to adopt a pet). The PAAS Shelter is located on 628 Wilson Street in Vinita and they are always accepting donations. They are a 501c3 organization, so your contribution can be tax deductible.


If You Don't Fit In -**Stand** Out

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






DAVY DYER CELEBRATION OF LIFE
