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May is **Motorcycle Awareness Month**. As I sit writing this I am thinking, "Shouldn't March and April and June and July be Motorcycle Awareness Months also? And what about all those other months as well?!"

I heard on the news awhile ago two motorcycles went down in Oklahoma today. There would probably be more crashes reported on Facebook too, if I could stand to get on there and look.

The citizenry of Oklahoma cannot blame sand for being on the roads this year causing crashes. It is just inattentive driving (and cell phones) causing these problems so early in the year. Oklahoma bikers, you know how many loved ones we have lost over the years. Please watch out for the cagers, because you know they are NOT watching out for you.

There is something else killing those I love. Oklahoma is in the throes of a prescription drug epidemic. I know many people currently being prescribed pain medication for various claimed illnesses. Some on them undoubtedly need it - others surely do not.

I'm concerned by addiction's pervasiveness in my community. After spending more than two years in a drug and alcohol program, one of my brothers recently returned home. He straightaway began searching for a doctor who would prescribe him narcotics. Now this isn't his first rodeo; he has been to rehab several times, and the ambulance has visited his home more than once when he was comatose from taking too many pills. His medical records should have "prescription drug abuse" written all over them in red! (Axis). Apparently, they do not check a person's medical history, because without hesitation they start writing my brother prescriptions for valium and painkillers. Of course, he takes all of the pills within two or three days. and is basically comatose until he runs out of pills. Now I am not saying he does not suffer from pain. However, if he takes all the pills in three davs and remains without them for the next 25 to 27 days, why can't he remain without them the other three days? Just sayin'.

I believe the only way to fight this type of problem is to initiate legal proceedings against the manufacturers of narcotics and the clinics who prescribe them unnecessarily. Each June the **Bedouin Shriners** in **Muskogee** holds the **Bedouin Shrine Poker Run** to help raise money to transport children to the **Shriners Hospitals for Children**.

The Shriners Hospitals is a network of 22 non-profit medical facilities across North America. Children with orthopedic conditions, burns, spinal cord injuries, and cleft lip and palate are eligible for care and receive all services in a familycentered environment, regardless of the patients' ability to pay.

Shriners in their effort to raise money to help sick and injured children isn't enough — the poker run offers a payout of more than \$4000 in cash and prizes. The stops for this year's Poker Run will be **CJ's Country Bar**, **Cookson Village**, **The Hideaway Bar and Grill**, and **Jamesville Y Bar** (say hi to Clint for us!). Folks, this is a beautiful scenic ride across Cherokee and Muskogee Counties and up around Lake Tenkiller. If you haven't ridden this ride in the past you are in for an awesome time!

The ride starts and ends at the Bedouin Shrine Temple located at 201 S. 6th in Muskogee. Registration is from 9-11 a.m. with last bike in at 5:30 p.m. Cash and prizes will be awarded beginning

"For any of us, some days can be tougher than others and even little things seem overwhelming, but too many of our military veterans face much bigger daily challenges: What about that veteran living in his car AND he has no food or personal hygiene items? How about a 76-year-old veteran who has worked his entire life, never asked for anything, but his retirement just doesn't stretch as far as it used to and he finds himself job-hunting for part-time work just to afford his medications, food and other basic needs? Or the young single dad, with two wonderful boys, who gets laid-off because the days he takes chemo for a brain tumor makes him unable to function but his VA claim is still pending? How about the vet who had to take several days of unpaid leave this month because his wife is extremely ill and can't care for their two small children?"

To return to the U.S. and find your benefits held up is enough to make anyone lose hope. **Sandy Oxford** and her band of military angels are battling the darkness vets face every day. The **TVC** staff go out into the streets (literally) and help so many get back some normal. They find vets help with PTSD, and help them with housing and jobs. Given that 22 veterans still commit suicide daily nationwide, their jobs are more of a calling.



AVMC is asking for you to come out for an evening of fun, food and affordable beers to help them help our veterans. You don't have to hire a sitter or spend big amounts of money. You do NOT have to be a biker or empty your 401K. They'll have dinners for \$5, you can buy a few stogies at the Cigar Box, make some new friends (bring some old ones with you – everybody's welcome) and you get a chance to check out the new golf bar; **The Flying Tee**. Check the **Riverwalk Rally Ad** for more info on times and what they're up to. Bring some dollars to shop businesses at the Riverwalk and vendors will have goodies for sale as well. We'll have updates on our website.


New for 2017: they have a Kid Zone, so pack the kids and the spouse and make a night of it. Be a hero without breaking the bank.

O-M-<mark>G Fest</mark>! Big hootenanny at Hatbox Field draws near

MUSKOGEE - The Okie from Muskogee is no longer with us, but his sons are carrying his torch. **Ben** and **Noel Haggard and the Strangers** will be one of the musical acts at this year's G Fest, June 15-17 at Hatbox Field.

The lineup of rock, country, Americana and red dirt bands for the second annual G-Fest is a little hard to believe. It is that good.

Kentucky Headhunters. Swon Brothers. John Fullbright. Nitty Gritty Dirt Band. Those are only a few of the great musical acts coming your way on four stages at this unique event.

Saturday night headliner **Creedence Clearwater Revisited** includes founding members of CCR, **Stu Cook** and **Doug "Cosmo" Clifford**, who were recently inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame.

G Fest (Muskogee is "The Gee") was partly made possibly by the work of **Jim Blair**, executive director of the **Oklahoma Music Hall of Fame** in Muskogee.

"What makes G Fest special - aside from taking place on an abandoned air strip, and Oklahoma's rich music history - is that there's something for everyone. Music lovers will find a little bit of everything from bluegrass to country, rock to folk and even **EDM** [electronic dance music] this year," Blair told *The Current Buzz*.




Though the line-up for the event is full of nationally-known artists, Oklahoma artists and bands will also be featured, as a special call was made for them.

Oklahoma favorite **Mike Hosty** will be on stage as his popular one-man band, playing drums with his feet, guitar and singing, while playing the harmonica. Hosty says he has a "huge underground following of bikers, sorority gals, hippies and truckers."

Camping is available in both a primitive campground with showers for \$80 and at an RV campsite with electric and water for \$325.

Options for tickets include VIP reserved seats, which guarantee seats closest to the stage and other perks. General admission tickets are \$89 for the whole event, and VIP seats are \$299.

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OAKS, Okla. – On December 27, 2016, a tragedy occurred which impacted many lives. Two very selfish people broke into the **Leach Volunteer Fire Department** and took the town's only fire truck. The thieves then used the stolen fire truck as a wrecking ball to enter the Oaks volunteer fire department, taking their truck as well.

After an all-night joyride, the thieves left both trucks stripped and destroyed. The uninsured equipment and supplies were either missing or unusable, including the \$30,000 "Jaws of Life." These were items that the firefighters and town had purchased out of their own pockets.

Nothing stopped Leach fire fighter **Mike Russell** from doing his best to aid in the call of duty. In February of this year he was servicing a call in the tanker truck. The fog was thick and visibility low. After misjudging the road, the truck flipped and rolled down a ravine costing this heroic firefighter his life.

Randall Sullateskee has been a Leach Volunteer Firefighter for more than 10 years. He wants to honor Russell by replacing the fire station's needs. On May 27, Sullateskee will host a fire station recovery run. Registration for the run begins at 10 a.m. at 5791 U.S. HWY 412 and will end at 2 p.m. in Oaks. A ticket will be given at each stop to win 1 of 2 free night's stay at the Cherokee Casino along with \$60 in free play. Poker hands are \$20 for the first hand and \$10 for additional hands. The best hand has a chance to win up to \$2,000! Gatortailz will be having a raffle and selling hotdogs, donating their proceeds as well.
