

The Beatles 1970 song, "Long and Winding Road" rolled around in my head as I turned off of Kansas Hwy 166 onto gravel road 27 and a short distance down the road onto Gallop Road. It wasn't bad for a gravel road, a little dusty, but the surface wasn't like driving on ball bearings. As you approached Dead End Rally grounds, you were greeted with an oasis of green grass, trees, a swimming hole, bikes, babes and tents. Did I mention the babes?

I knew I must have arrived at Steve Rinck's Dead End Spring Rally because the day was hotter than hell. Events included: male and female barrel keg throw, barrel roll, Slow race, cherry bite, Hot dog bite, barrel racing, keyhole race. The female barrel keg throw generated special attention when one of the contestants took off her t-shirt so she could get an "uninhibited" throw.

There were food and T-shirt vendors to satisfy your thirst and appetite and need for bling, but the two attractions that garnered the most audience attention were the titty licking and build-yourown-bikini contests. If I have to describe the titty licking contest to you, you are too young to be reading this article. The build-your-own-bikini contests requires contestants to build and wear a bikini they built only from discarded items found around the rally grounds. An example were the beer bottle caps that were used to cover one lady's.... use your imagination to figure how she used them. A lot of bush leaves were used in strategic locations. TECH TIPS

Why Synthetic Oil is Better For Your Motorcycle



Let us start with some history about synthetic oils. Synthetic oil has been in development since 1877. Synthetic oils are built with individual molecules. Pre-Ride Safety Meeting



Am I ready?? Where do I start? How does this work? Who do I ask? How can I stay safe? How do we bring new riders into the group rides?

While riding alone is sometimes the goal, one of the **best** experiences you can have on a motorcycle is to ride in a group of close friends.

A pre-ride safety meeting is *important* for all the participants to **feel safe and have fun**! This meeting lets the group know where you are going and if there will be any stops along the way, along with informing riders of safety procedures. Getting to your destination safely is your primary goal. Having FUN along the way is the added bonus! Many things should be discussed. Some briefly and some with some added time and focus depending on the group that is riding that day.

The Lead and the Sweep (Trail) rider in the group should be the most experienced riders. There should be a maximum of 7-10 riders in a whole group unless it is on a road with less traffic or the whole group is experienced in riding together.

Having too many riders can become dangerous as the group will then have limited flexibility to move and navigate on the road.

Every group will have riders with a variety of riding experience. The primary goal is to keep each rider comfortable and safe. The Ride Captain should take each rider's skills and comfort level into consideration when placing the riders in the group. Novice riders should be placed behind the lead rider. The lead rider is responsible for setting the pace and can keep an eye on anything that could become a problem during the ride, for example: speed, traffic, weather, and road conditions. They should keep an eye out and be skilled in communicating with the rest of the group. The sweep rider is in charge of keeping tabs on the group and watching for wanderers, mechanical problems or anything that would put the group in danger.

Riders with more group experience should be placed closer to the back of the group.

Trikes and other 3-wheelers should always ride at the very back of the group due to their width and difference of handling.

Basic hand signals should be quickly discussed. Not so much as to overload someone new to the group, but to help the communication process become more predictable and consistent.

These basic parts of a pre-ride meeting will help promote the comfort of riding together as a group and make the ride more enjoyable.

It's easy to think a pre-ride safety meeting isn't necessary and may be repetitive. But you never know when helping a rider to focus on the task at hand will be the most important moment of the day. **DON'T SKIP IT!! SAFETY MATTERS!!**

Motorcycle History Harley-Davidson's Flathead (Side Valve)


I am sure everyone has heard of Harley's Flathead (side valve). Heck back in the day, every manufacturer that produced engines had a flathead. Before the advent of overhead valves, that was the thing. Simple, reliable, and inexpensive but performance, now that's another story. It's hard to imagine Harley



produced its 45 flathead in the three-wheeled Servi-Car until production ceased in 1973. Really, talk about out dated! But early on, the flathead was the deal. The flathead engine saw service in Harley-Davidson motorcycles beginning with the Model W's flat-twin. produced from 1919 to 1923. In the domestic U.S. market, the 45-cubic-inch (740 cc) D model (1929 to 1931) and its technical descendant, the R model (1932 to 1936). The D and R models featured a total-loss oiling system and were succeeded in 1937 by the W 45, which had recirculating oil lubrication. The WLA (W = return oil, L = performance, A = army) went on to serve in World War II as the U.S. and Canadian Army's WLC (C = Canada) primary two-wheeled mount and subsequently as a civilian middleweight through 1952.



In 1952, the K series flatheads was introduced with the same bore and stroke, selling in parallel with the W series (which was discontinued after 1952), designed to compete with British sporting motorcycles of the time. The K models featured a 750cc unit construction engine and transmission case, right side foot shift and left side foot brake. From 1954 to 1956, the KH received an increase in stroke to 4-9/16" to bring displacement to 888cc (54 cubic inches). The K series was replaced by the overhead valve Sportster series in the retail market in 1957 (key

word "retail"). The American Motorcycle Association (AMA) class C rules of 1952 allowed sidevalves of 750cc to compete against 500cc overhead valve bikes. The 750cc KR factory racer was highly competitive in dirt track and road racing, and was produced in limited numbers until 1969, when the AMA changed the rules by increasing the Class C displacement limit to 750 cc. Without the displacement advantage, the KR flatheads were not competitive against 750 cc overhead valve bikes (the K series was truly done).



In 1930, the 74-cubic-inch (1,210 cc) VL flathead replaced the JD Big Twin, which had



featured intake-over-exhaust valve configuration. In 1937, that engine was redesigned to include a recirculating lubrication system, and designated the model U, and it went into the same frame and running gear configuration as the model E Knucklehead, which had



originated in 1936. The U continued to be produced in varying configurations as a 74 cubic inch U & UL (1937 to 1948), and 80 cubic inch UH




& ULH engine (1937 to 1941). By 1948, the first year of the aluminum-head Panhead, it had been thoroughly superseded and outsold in the




marketplace by the superior performance of the overhead valve model Big Twins. Truly the end of an era!



VA Policy on Medical Marijuana



There are conflicting opinions if, or how marijuana use affects a Veteran's VA eligibility. We went directly to the Veteran's Health Administration (VHA) to get the most reliable answers possible. We are not offering legal, or medical advice. We neither encourage nor discourage marijuana use. We just want to end the confusion.

Governments Positions on Marijuana – Under federal law, cannabis is a controlled substance, like cocaine and heroin. The federal government places controlled substances in a schedule, according to its potential for abuse and medicinal value. Cannabis is classified as a Schedule I drug, which means that the federal government views cannabis as highly addictive, having no medical value. Doctors may not "prescribe" cannabis for medical use under federal law, though they can "recommend" its use under the First Amendment.

Marijuana is legal under Oklahoma law Title 310, Chapter 681 for medical use by patients holding a state issued medical marijuana patient license. The license requires a physician's certification, but is easy and inexpensive to obtain. Veterans even get a license discount.

As of this printing, the federal government claims that marijuana is not a medicine. The Federal government has the constitutional authority to prohibit marijuana for all purposes. Federal law enforcement may prosecute medical marijuana patients, even if users grow their own marijuana, or if they reside in a state where medical marijuana is legal.

The court does not say that medical marijuana laws of any state are unconstitutional; nor does it invalidate them in any way. Also, it does not say that federal officials <u>must</u> prosecute users. Decisions about prosecution are left to the discretion of the Federal government.

Veterans Administration's Position Directive 1315, dated:12/8/2017 – defines access to VHA clinical programs for Veterans participating in a stateapproved marijuana program.

VA providers and pharmacists must discuss marijuana use with any Veterans requesting information about marijuana, as to its clinical relevance to patient care.

VA providers should discuss how use of state-approved medical marijuana to treat medical or psychiatric symptoms or conditions may relate to the Veteran's participation in other clinical activities, (e.g., discuss how marijuana may impact other aspects such as how it may interact with other medications



the Veteran is taking, or how it may impact other aspects of the overall care such as pain management, Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD), or substance abuse treatment).

Providers need to make decisions to modify treatment plans based on marijuana use on a case-by-case basis. Such decisions need to be made in partnership with the Veteran and must be based on concerns regarding Veteran health and safety.

Providers cannot recommend, refer, complete forms, or register Veterans for participation in state-approved programs.

The VA provider or pharmacist will not provide marijuana nor will VA pay for marijuana from a non-VA entity.

Possession of marijuana, even for authorized medical reasons, by Veterans while on VA property is a violation of federal law and places them at risk for prosecution.

VA employees, including those who are Veterans receiving care through VA, are prohibited from using marijuana.

If a Veteran reports marijuana use and/or participation in

a state-approved marijuana program to a member of the clinical staff, that information is entered into the "non-VA/ herbal/Over the Counter (OTC) medication section" of the Veteran's medical record.

If a provider discusses marijuana with a Veteran, relevant information must be documented in progress notes, and considered in the development or modification of the treatment plan.

Notes – Some veterans groups advise veteran NOT to sign any "pain contracts" with your VA doctors. "Pain Contracts" are NOT VA forms, therefore the veteran should question their need. "Veterans Pain Care Act of 2008, (HR 6445)" requires the VA to treat veteran's pain.

The VA Ethics Board recommends that veterans assert themselves in requesting discussion or information with VA doctors on the proper use of medical marijuana for pain or other conditions.

In Summary • The VA will not deny you medical services just because you possess a Medical Marijuana license or use marijuana.

 You can be arrested under Federal law if you bring marijuana or its duratives onto a VA facility.

 The VA will record your use of marijuana, if you tell them, or they detect it on your lab tests.

 The VA encourages you to inform them if you are using medical marijuana so they can properly diagnose and treat you.


