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# Motorcycle History THE EVOLUTION


(CAN YOU BELIEVE IT'S BEEN 37 YEARS)

In 1981, the MoCo purchased itself back from AMF (management organized buyout). Their first job was to reorganize the MoCo (financially), and improve the product to be competitive. The new engine design was named the "Evolution" and




The Evolution 1983 - 1999

the rest is history! This engine went into production as the MoCo's primary power plant in the 1984 model year although the engine previewed in some models in 1983. A true blessing in disguise, if you had ever had the pleasure of riding an old Shovelhead. The original Shovelhead was a generator case unit, basically an upgrade of the Panhead. In 1970, the MoCo changed the lower end of the Shovelhead

to an "alternator case". In my opinion the worst screw up the MoCo ever made. The new design had one upside, improved charging system,

however the down sides were so numerous, I could not fit into this entire magazine. So let me give you a basic rundown on what changes were made to improve the engine and create the "Evo" (this is just the highlights). First, all the oil ports in the engine were decreased in size by about 50%, which meant less volume, but more pressure (the top end would actually get oil now), changed the cylinders from cast iron to aluminum (with steel sleeves), this would increase cooling. Next, the flywheels were lightened up so as to increase engine RPM's and decrease

vibration. The result was a very good engine that could run faster with less maintenance and go for 100,000 miles (or more) virtually trouble free! The new design for the rocker boxes and valve covers had a

square "box" looking design, which drew the nick name the "blockhead", however it never stuck (thank God), and the

history at the "Evo"! Had it not been for this engine, I do not think we would be riding Harleys today. Truly the engine that saved the MoCo. In 1986, after much success, the MoCo carried over the Evo design to the Sportsters. However 1999 was pretty much the end of the Evo for big twins as "Twin Cams" came into play. Although

engine will go down in

the Evo design lives on, the Sportster remains virtually unchained (just a few minor



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### WINTERIZING YOUR MOTORCYCLE

For many motorcyclists across the country, this time of year marks a crucial maintenance time for their rides - winterization. Some fortunate riders farther south enjoy a year-round cycling climate, but if you're not one of the lucky ones, you need to follow a few important steps to protect your bike over the winter months ahead. The following steps should help to assist you in winterizing your motorcycle so this spring you can hit the road with no trouble.

### Step 1

Gather up the tools and associated products you'll need for your winterizing task. You'll need:

- Cleaning cloths
- Spark plug wrench
- Trickle battery charger
- Motorcycle oil
- New oil filter
- Oil can or accessory to get oil in the cylinders
- Chain lube (if you have a chain drive)
- Fuel stabilizer
- WD40
- Breathable motorcycle cover
- Kitchen plastic wrap
- Rubber bands
- Vinyl or plastic gloves
- · Items to clean and wax your bike
- A dry, secure, and preferably heated area to store your motorcycle

### Step 2

Clean your bike throroughly. A gentle detergent and water works fine. By removing road grime and bugs you'll protect the finish of your bike. Avoid spraying water directly into the exhaust because if the baffles get wet prior to storage, it could develop

rust. It's also best to not get water in the air cleaner. If the air cleaner housing gets wet, it could act as a choke, making your motorcycle difficult to start. Dry your bike completely with a good chamois, clean and polish all aluminum and stainless surfaces with an approved metal polish, and apply a coat of wax on all painted and chrome surfaces. Spray WD40 on the drive chain to remove any debris, and then spray chain lube on the entire length of the chain.

### Step 3

Add fuel stabilizer to your gas tank and then completely fill your gas tank with fuel. This is very important step because as fuel ages, more volatile components tend to change, leaving a sludge and gummy substances that can affect the carburetor. After filling the gas tank, run the bike so the fuel and stabilizer gets into the carburetor and fuel injectors. Turn off the fuel and then let it run dry.

### Step 4

If you have a carburetor, drain the float bowls, shut off the gas petcock, and drain the gas from the carburetor bowls. Refer to your owner's manual for the location of your drain screws. If you have a fuel-injected bike then there isn't anything to drain.

### Step 5

Start your motorcycle and let it run until the engine gets warm. You can now change the oil and oil filter. The reason for this is because over periods of extended storage, old oil can develop acidic qualities, which can corrode engine components.

### Step 6

Use an oil squirting device to apply oil over the stationary tubes on the front forks. Get on the bike, hold the front brake and press the front end up and down to work the front suspension. This keeps the rubber seals from drying out and protects the exposed fork tubes.

### Step 7

Remove your spark plug wires and remove the plugs. With your oil-squirting device, squirt some motor oil in the cylinders. Approximately one teaspoon of oil will work well. Tuck the plug wires away somewhere safe so they do not arc, then spin the

motor with the starter for a few revolutions to get the oil spread around. Remember to keep your face away from the spark plug holes. Oil will squirt out! Clean and gap the plugs, put them back in, and attach the plug wires.

### Step 8

You may want to remove the battery. Some batteries may require charging every four weeks with a battery tender type of charger. Built-up sulfates on the plates can ruin a battery during cold storage and inactivity. A thin coat of Vaseline to the terminals on the battery can prevent corrosion. This small step will mean an easier spring start up and no extra cost of battery replacement.

### Step 9

If your bike has a liquid cooling system, check its level of antifreeze with a hygrometer. Drain, flush and replace antifreeze if necessary. We suggest this replacement be done every two years. Do not leave the antifreeze level low or empty; this could lead to rust or corrosion of the cooling sytem. Check all other fluid levels at this time.

### Step 10

Lube your cables, suspension, pivot points, and drive shaft, if you have one. Also make sure to check the air cleaner and fuel filter, and inspect the brake pads.

### Step 11

Clean and treat all leather with a high quality dressing.

### Step 12

If your storage location is bare concrete, we suggest using a piece of plywood, MDF, or old thick carpet to insulate the bike from becoming damp. You may also want to remove weight from the tires by placing your motorcycle on a bike stand or placing it on the center stand if you have one.

### Step 13

Using a soft clean cloth, wipe a good quality light machine oil over all the metal surfaces, except the disc brakes. Spray WD40 in the exhaust pipe and cover it and the air intake with plastic wrap and a rubber band. You can also cover drain hoses as well

to prevent pests from making a nest in your exhaust system.

### Step 14

Do not start and run the engine for short periods of time over the storage period because this can lead to condensation due to engine and combustion byproducts in the oil.

By following the above steps, you'll protect your motorcycle during storage so when the riding season gets here all you have to do is remove the shield or storage cover, check your tire pressure, give the bike a good wash, install the battery, if it was removed, remove the plastic cover, give it a good tune up, and you're ready to ride!



Covid-19 information is changing almost hourly, but we wanted to bring the latest information to our veterans. As of the first week in December, 2020, two pharmaceutical companies have applied for emergency approval of their Covid-19 vaccines.

The Department of Veterans Affairs expects to distribute corona virus vaccines by mid-December, with a focus on inoculating high-risk veterans and VA staff members, said VA officials. Physicians and doctors treating veterans in Covid-19 wards will receive top priority for the vaccine, said VA Secretary Robert Wilkie.

Planning is underway at VA to deliver a COVID-19 vaccine when one becomes available and is planning on offering the vaccine first to health care personnel and Veterans. VA is working with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) to develop a plan. The plan takes into consideration a number of

risk factors, including risks of acquiring infection, severe illness and death if infected, and transmitting the disease, as well as the risk to essential workers, including health care personnel. The VA's effort will be an early test of the federal government's enormous task of vaccine distribution as infections and daily deaths increase. More than 5,000 veterans have died under VA care, along with 74 staff members, according to VA data

VA medical centers across the country ran exercises in late October to prepare for initial receipt of the vaccine. Initial supplies will be limited. The VA will offer the vaccine first to high-risk health care personnel, as they are essential in continuing to care for patients throughout the pandemic. As more vaccines become available, VA will offer the vaccine to high-risk Veterans. The VA will offer COVID-19 vaccine free to all Veterans enrolled in VA

health care, who want to be vaccinated

VA medical centers across the country performed planning exercises late in October to prepare for initial receipt of the vaccine. These exercises helped determine how they will distribute immunizations. They based the decisions on the number of doses available and coordinated communications with Veterans to schedule their immunization. They also addressed ordering, storage, handling, and administration of the vaccine. Additionally, VA has been conducting listening sessions and interviews with Veterans across the country to gauge their interest and determine the best methods for reaching out to our diverse Veteran population.

VA volunteers are undergoing vaccine tests at five military medical treatment centers including: Naval Medical Center San Diego; Brooke Army Medical Center, San Antonio; Wilford Hall Ambulatory Surgical Center, San Antonio; Walter Reed National Military Medical Center, Bethesda; and Fort Belvoir Community Hospital.

The efforts to distribute over 20 million vaccine doses per month to 300 million

Americans is being led by US Army General Gus Perna, who is in charge of Operation Warp Speed - the program created by the Trump administration to produce and coordinate the distribution of the Covid-19 vaccine. Your local VA facility will update you as vaccines become available.

A number of veteran motorcycle clubs are members of the Oklahoma Confederation of Clubs (CoC). These veteran clubs assist and provide comradery for veterans, whether they ride or not. The Court Watch Team has resumed tracking case CF-2018-011 in Tillman County. In July 2019, the defendant plead guilty to Count 1, Leaving the Scene of a Fatal Accident and Count 2, Negligent Homicide. The defendant caused the death of a motorcyclist by leaving the scene of the crash, with the motorcycle and the victim on fire. The defendant was sentenced to imprisonment for 10 years with 2 years suspended sentence. Having served less than 18 months of his sentence, the defendant recently filed a motion to modify his sentence and be released from custody. The Court Watch Team has contacted the District Attorney in this case, strongly opposing the defendant's early release from custody.

The Court Watch Team monitors court cases and communicates with the District Attorneys' offices to let them know that the motorcycling community is watching. We urge the District Attorney not to engage in plea negotiations to lesser charges.








# TOY RUNS - CATOOSA











It's been more than two years since Harley-Davidson announced it was entering into the e-bike world, finally the wait is over. The century-old nameplate has just announced its new bicycle brand with the launch of a flagship model.



The Serial 1 Cycle Company and its two-wheeler, Serial 1, were both named after the very first motorcycle Harley-Davidson's ever built, called, the Number One." This puppy is miles apart from the low-slung, easyriding choppers that have become synonymous with Harlev. actually looks more like a modernday e-bike and is proving its worth for the e-bike market

The e-bike looks little like its century-old predecessor but, offers two-wheel electric propulsion. This means its way more eco-friendly than its petrol-guzzling, 117-year-old predecessor. It also means you

can ride farther, faster and with less effort than a traditional bicycle, making it an ideal companion for urban commuting.



When Harley-Davidson first put power to two wheels in 1903, it changed how the world moved forever. Inspired by the entrepreneurial vision of Harley-Davidson's founders, they hope to once again to change how cyclists and the cycling-curious move around their world with a Serial 1 eBicycle."

The company will officially debut its first line of electric bicycles in Spring 2021 and says the Serial 1 prototype that's currently making the rounds is a styling exercise, not necessarily intended for mass production. This means that specs are scant. Still, it gives some indication as to what cyclists can expect in terms of aesthetics.

Like the original Serial Number One, the e-bike features a sleek black frame, stark white tires, a Brooks leather saddle and matching leather handgrips. It features a mid-drive motor and a belt drive system that resembles a Gates Carbon Drive setup. It has headlights and taillights integrated into the frame, thru-axle wheel hubs and what could possibly be Tektro dual-piston hydraulic disc brakes on 203 mm rotors.

The dynamic, fast-growing eBicycle market is at the forefront of a global mobility revolution. The introduction of Serial 1 allows Harley-Davidson to play a key role in this mobility revolution, and allow Serial 1 to focus exclusively on the eBicycle customer and deliver an unmatched riding experience rooted in freedom and adventure."

The global e-bike market was valued at more than \$15 billion in 2019 and is projected to grow at an annual rate of greater than six percent from 2020 to 2025. Harley-Davidson does not want to miss out on this opportunity.





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
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
