





No one seems to want to take credit for the invention of the boattail design (for good reason). However they were, and are, a part of HD's colorful history. I am going to guess that some time in about 1969 some genius at HD came up with an idea for the Sportster. A sort of uni-body seat/fender made of fiberglass. Which was introduced as an option on the 1970 model year Sportsters, and continued on into 1971. On top of being UGLY, they were not very popular. Which really begs as to why this






story goes on. From 1934 to 1970, with the exception of the Servi-Car, there had been two distinct lines of V-Twin Harley-Davidson motorcycles, the small twins and the big twins. However, individual bikers would sometimes customize bikes to suit their tastes. Back when AMF owned HD, and believe it or not, "Willie G." was their styling director.



This is where it gets a little odd. Willie G. was aware of this "user customizing" and decided to design a motorcycle for production that would have the look of the custom bikes. To accomplish this, he started with the frame and rear suspension, but not the electric starter, from the FLH Electra Glide, to which he then mated the smaller telescopic forks from the XLH Sportster. This combination was referred to as the FX chassis, where "FX" meant "Factory eXperimental". The drivetrain and engine accessories were from the FLH, the front headlights and brakes were from the XLH. This use of a mixture of FL and XL parts has also been used to explain the FX designation. To complete the Super Glide, he added buckhorn handlebars and an optional "boattail"



fender unit similar to those being offered on the XLH Sportster. The production FX Super Glide was released in 1971 to a lukewarm reception. Particularly not well received was the "boattail" option, which also proved to be unpopular on the Sportsters that had it. Most folks eventually took off and tossed the boattails, however in today's market an untouched or original restored boattail, FX or XLH are worth several times what they cost new. To the best of my knowledge, the boattail Sportsters were only 1970 and 71, and 1971 the only year for the boattail Superglide. Regardless of just how ugly they were, they are very much the "Classic" and very nostalgic!



#### Avoid Prolonged Sunlight Exposure

Keep tires in a cool, dark area of the garage and avoid temperature extremes. Don't leave them outside or near a windowed door where the sun's rays can shine through. Obviously, when you ride, especially in the summer, tires get lots of sun exposure so look for shade when parking outdoors and this leads us to the next tip...

#### Take Tires for a Spin

You'd think keeping motorcycle tires covered in the garage away from the sun and elements would greatly extend their life, however, a prolonged lack of use prevents the additives and waxes manufactured into the tire from doing their job. These

protective substances squeeze out during normal operation and recoat the tire keeping it fresh and maintained. If left in a sitting position for too long the protective additives dry up along with the uncoated sections of tire.

#### **Maintain Air Pressure**

Preventing tire damage offers another reason to ensure proper inflation of the tires. Underinflated tires crumple the sidewalls causing cracking which in turn leaks air. Once this process has started, you can't turn back time and eventually the tires age quicker as a result of the cracks.

#### Age

You have no control over the age of the tires. Even well-kept tires age which leads to

fading, cracking and damage. You can prevent premature aging by maintaining the tires and following the tips above but eventually the rubber and protective additives in the tire break down rendering it useless.

#### **Keep Tires Clean**

Tires battle all the road has to offer, so leaving caked on mud or even a light dusting of dirt can degrade the embedded protectants and promote dryness. Wash the tires using water and avoid harsh chemicals and soaps as these also break down the rubber.

#### **Proper Motorcycle Tire Storage Tips**

If you ride seasonally or take extended absences off your motorcycle then store the tires appropriately in between rides. Keep tires off the ground by using a motorcycle stand and keep them properly inflated. You should check the air pressure once a month or so, inflate as necessary and always check prior to riding. Tire covers might not be a bad idea, especially if you live in extreme hot and cold regions.

If possible, go for a ride, get the tires warm and under pressure. Doing this just a couple of times during the offseason with proper inflation levels probably helps sustain the life of tires more than anything else.

Lastly, don't use cleaners or shine products made from oil, normally labeled as petroleum distillates. While these sharpen the look of tires in the short run, in the long run the waxes and protective additives break down, age the tires and increase the chance of tire damage. If you see the beginnings of cracking along the sidewall, a water-based protectant can help extend the life of the tire but start thinking about some replacements.

#### Stay up to date

To read the date code on motorcycle tires, you must find the 4-digit part of the DOT code on the sidewall of a tire. The first pair of numbers means the week, and the second pair means the year.



#### THE BARRACKS

When You Need a Helping Hand



Barracks. Probably most of us thought we had heard the last of the word "barracks", after separating from the service. Whether your experience in the barracks were good or bad, I am here to share a great, new barrack's experience with you.

The Barracks is located at 4717 W.Okmulgee ave. Muskogee, OK 74401, about ten blocks south of the VA hospital. A convenient location since The Barracks has several service agencies that can help vets with their VA claims. The Barracks is open to all active military and veterans men and women of the Air Force, Army, Coast Guard, Marines, Navy, and the Reserves. Your separation status does not matter. The Barracks has different halls in the building to honor the different services, women and Native American vets.

The Barracks had to repair the building which suffered over \$60,000 in vandalism over the winter. Most of the building damage has been repaired, but The Barracks remained closed during the Covid-19 pandemic. They expect to resume operations in June.

The Barracks, a vacant nursing home, was converted to a veteran service complex. It includes: an entertainment room with TVs and game consoles, library with books and phonograph players, art room, two workout rooms. chapel, computer lab, barbershop, the clothes closet, coffee and soda bars, kitchen, food pantry. The barbershop and clothes closet (business clothing that vets can borrow) help vets give a business appearance when job seeking. The computer lab helps vets learn or sharpen their



computer skills and prepare their resume, so critical in today's workplace.

Service organizations housed at The Barracks include the American Legion, DAV, KIBOIS, and Veterans Rally Point. A vet could visit The Barracks, get a cup of coffee or soda, visit necessary organizations, chill in the entertainment lounge or the

library, work out, and visit with other vets – one stop shopping and all free to the vet.

One of the motivations behind The Barracks is suicide prevention. The organizers feel that veterans plagued with dark thoughts of harm, would be better served in a safe place, among veterans with similar military experiences, and support organizations located just down the hall.

The Barracks offers their building, at no charge to motorcycle clubs and organization meetings, or poker runs. All they ask is that





you clean up after yourselves. Talk to Victor for details and available dates. We included his contact information in the next paragraph.

All these services and opportunities sound great, but they come at a price. The Barracks receives some community support, but they rely on donations of labor, supplies and most importantly money. They are a 501c3 charitable organization with no paid employees. All donations support utilities, operational expenses and supplies – no high paid executives here. You can contact Victor for




















Riding a motorcycle is fun. Until the hazards of the road appear and we may, or may not, know how to properly deal with them. Some hazards make everyday riding a dangerous adventure without the proper "tools" in our toolkit to pull out and deal with what we are facing.

- Rough roadways –
   Construction, resurfacing, bumpy patches at an intersection
- Slippery surfaces Roadway paint, train tracks, oil, leaves

- Standing water This could indicate a hidden pot hole and not knowing how deep the hole could be.
- Gravel On the sides of the roadway or washed up in unexpected areas. It's like riding on marbles and makes the motorcycle hard to handle.



 Debris – Branches, tire treads, trash – things that

become necessary to swerve around.

 Uneven lanes --- edges between the lanes can grab at a tire and throw a motorcycle off balance, either while changing lanes or going around a curve.



#### Ways to navigate through road hazards

- Wear the GEAR! Yes, even in the heat! The gear can save your life and your limbs.
   Full-fingered gloves come in textile that is even cooling to the hands and, in case of a fall, can save your fingers and hands.
- Don't make sudden moves that could cause you to slip or get the bike off balance
- Use both brakes when stopping to help the suspension stop the motorcycle smoothly
- Slowdown in these circumstances! Give yourself space and time to react
- Read the road ahead in order to detect a road hazard as soon as possible

 If you are rusty with your skills, as most of us are in the Spring, take a few minutes to practice the top 3: Emergency braking, swerving and negotiating a curve. It could save your life! OR take a refresher MSF course or a course with the Tulsa Police or Broken Arrow Police Department on your own bike.

Out of a great need, a movement was born. In 2017, a member of ABATE of Oklahoma was contacted by a concerned citizen inquiring if we could lend support to the family of a victim killed in a motorcycle crash. The young victim was hit and killed by a driver; the driver was facing criminal prosecution. Members of ABATE of Oklahoma and other community-minded riding associations wrote over 200 letters to the District Attorney requesting that justice be served, and the defendant not be allowed to negotiate a plea to lesser charges. We proudly and respectfully attended the pre-trial conference, subsequent change of plea hearing (where the defendant plead guilty to all charges) and the sentencing hearing. Since that time, the "Court Watch Oklahoma Team" has lent support to other families facing similar tragedies. We spend significant time contacting the respective police departments and district attorneys to determine why multiple cases have not proceeded. The results have been positive.

It is not our intention to influence the prosecution of a case; we simply want it to be known that the motorcycling community is watching cases involving the alleged negligent injury or death of a motorcyclist.

The Court Watch Oklahoma Team is currently tracking the following court cases pending in Oklahoma. Criminal charges were filed, by the respective District Attorney, in cases where a driver is charged with causing serious injury or death to a motorcyclist. \*

# **GYPSY SYNDICATE TATTOO SHOP**



Have you ever received a tattoo that you regretted? Well I was the recipient of a bad tattoo believe it or not and it was done on my back in a guy's garage while he was inebriated. This was done in the age when tattoos were not exactly legal. Therefore it took another professional to point out the fact that my tattoo was not exactly as I had planned it to be. This is where a professional tattoo artist is very important especially when it comes to ink that you're going to carry with you for the rest of your life.

Then I went to Gypsy Syndicate Tattoo who are headquartered out of McAlester OK. They specialize in touch ups and redo for you who have gone down a similar path. They are about quality above all things. They are a broad base of tattoo artists that are grouped together that form the alliance called Gypsy Syndicate Tattoo. They do not have any specialization types, they welcome any and all type of tattoo needed. These guys live by a code, and in that code, and the code is about integrity and honesty and delivery of a good product.

The two gentlemen that I'm speaking of are called T-Bone and Sideshow. They both come from an old school of tattoo artist with special influences by Norman Collins (Sailor Jerry). You may have heard of an artist called Sailor Jerry or a specialized rum by the same name. Well these gentlemen at Gypsy Syndicate were heavily influenced by Norman Collins and a type of tattoo art that he did which is considered today mostly old school and not

commercialized like that you find on television shows that are just part of the mass media.

They came to Oklahoma by way of Arizona and this is the 14th shop that they have opened since they began tattooing many years ago. They had shops in Arizona, Utah, Texas, Tennessee, Arkansas, and now McAllister Oklahoma. They have family here in Oklahoma and that is why they have chosen to stay here. So you see, their roots are here.

These gentlemen don't just tattoo They also ride bikes, T-Bone has a Custom





Hardtail Springer with a 131 cubic inch engine he received after succumbing to an accident and replacing his former bike. Now Sideshow, who also rides, has a Softail with an 80 cubic inch and it has been slightly customized as well, with a 45 degree rake among other things. Sideshow says this bike has been customized by a good friend of his with some parts he had lying about and he's proud to say that he has no problem keeping up with the crowd. They both like to get out ride as often as possible but lately they've been so busy they have been relegated to just riding to the shop and back. But you'll see them out occasionally hitting rallies and things on their bikes.

They are opening up a new shop in Wilburton Oklahoma and it will be open in about

three or four months. They are planning it to be open sometime this summer and are wanting to appeal to the southeastern part of Oklahoma and maybe people in the Fort Smith area. If you're ever in the area and feel that you are ready for some artwork, or repair, you need to drop by and give these guys a holler, especially if you got a jacked up tattoo like I did and need some work done. There is never a bad time to go see these guys, they will take you as a walk in if they can.




**WINNING**




